



WELCOME TO CENTRAL BAPTIST CHURCH

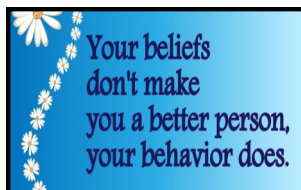

NO ONE EVER CARED FOR ME LIKE JESUS



Charles Frederick Weigle was born in Lafayette, IN on November 20, 1871. He was converted at the age of twelve. With the help of Christian friends and an unswerving faith in God, he became a true and faithful laborer for Jesus Christ. Later, he felt the call of God and surrendered to preach the Gospel. His life of service to God was enhanced greatly by his ability to write gospel songs.

Dr. Weigle was not without his hours of trouble and heartache. Yet it seems that out of these grievous sorrows flowed forth one of the most beautiful and widely known of his songs. It has been sung around the world and translated into many languages.

One day Dr. Weigle came home to find a note from his wife declaring that she was leaving and going to the “world” to get the things that she felt were owed to her. She no longer wanted to be the wife of an evangelist.

This situation threw him into such a state of depression that he actually thought of ending his life. As he was wondering if anyone cared, he heard a small voice within saying, “Charlie, I haven’t forgotten you. I still care for you.”

At this, he fell to his knees asking God to forgive him for not trusting Him completely and determined never again to let such a thought cross his mind.

In less than five years his wife was dead. While reflecting on the past experiences and the goodness of God who carried him through the heartache, he once again felt the urge to write a song. The song would be a summation of his whole life’s experience with his wonderful Lord. He later said that “the lyric came as fast as I could put it down.” It was the first song he had written since his world fell apart. Now, he wanted everyone to know that “No One Ever Cared For Me Like Jesus.”

How often have you wondered, “Does anyone really care?”

Well, there is One who loves you and cares for you more than you care for yourself. Turn every problem over to Him!
